Assay Used to Measure Bioactivity: Interferon was titrated with the use of the cytopathic effect inhibition assay as described [Rubinstein, S., Familletti, P.C., and Pestka, S. (1981) "Convenient Assay for Interferons," *J. Virol.* 37, 755-758; Familletti, P.C., Rubinstein, S., and Pestka, S. (1981) "A Convenient and Rapid Cytopathic Effect Inhibition Assay for Interferon," in *Methods in Enzymology*, Vol. 78 (S. Pestka, ed.), Academic Press, New York, 387-394]. In this antiviral assay for interferon about 1 unit/ml of interferon is the quantity necessary to produce a cytopathic effect of 50%. As there is no international standard for human interferon omega, the units are determined with respect to the international reference standard for human interferon alpha A (Hu-IFN- A) provided by the National Institutes of Health [see Pestka, S. (1986) "Interferon Standards and General Abbreviations," in *Methods in Enzymology* (S. Pestka, ed.), Academic Press, New York 119, 14-23]. Unit of activity measured on human lung carcinoma cell line A549 with encephalomyocarditis virus (EMCV).

Physical State of Product During Shipping: Frozen

Storage Conditions/Comments: After receipt, the product should be kept at -20°C or below for retention of full activity. Thaw product vial by incubation in cold tap water until just thawed . the contents of the tube should be apportioned in separate tubes so that freezing and thawing is kept to a minimum. Refreezing should be done on dry ice or in a dry ice/alcohol bath. Further dilution of the product should be in buffers containing protein such as 2% bovine serum albumin (BSA).
